



## **COMMISSION ON SCHOOL REFORM**

### **BULLETIN: SURVEY RESULTS**

#### **BACKGROUND**

In November 2011, the think tanks Reform Scotland and the Centre for Scotlish Public Policy set up the Commission on School Reform to consider whether the school system in Scotland is meeting the present and future needs of young people and to make specific recommendations as to how the system might be improved or suggest areas that require further enquiry.

The Commission has the following objectives:

- to form a fair and objective view of Scotland's educational performance compared to what is provided elsewhere,
- to consider the challenges that Scottish education is likely to face in the next 50 years and how likely it is to meet those challenges,
- to identify any problems within the current school system in Scotland and try to analyse the root causes of them, and
- to develop proposals that will enable young people, whatever their background, to fulfil their potential and meet the unprecedented challenges of the modern world.

The Commission invited comment from all with an interest in Scottish school education and is currently considering the oral and written evidence received ahead of publishing a final report in early 2013. That report will offer suggestions for Government and look to assist young people, parents, teachers and others to shape their own objectives for the education system.

#### **CONTEXT**

As part of the wider evidence gathering process the Commission carried out an online survey of people's views of the Scottish school education system. The survey was promoted through social networks and received 326 responses. The following tables break down the responses to the questions depending on whether the respondent is still at school or how long ago they left full time education.

We accept this survey is not scientific and participants were self-selecting, however, it does present some interesting findings. For example:

- 61 per cent said that they did not think the Scottish school education system was sufficiently ambitious for both its pupils and Scotland
- 63 per cent thought their school education was geared towards them passing exams
- 49 per cent said they did not feel they were given enough support and advice to help with the transition from school
- 59 per cent said they did not think young people had sufficient say in relation to their education
- 62 per cent said that they understood the Curriculum for Excellence and how it would change school education
- While 74 per cent felt that the Scottish school education system helped them reach their potential, 36 per cent said that system only helped more academically able children to reach their potential

Generally, the findings echo the sentiment outlined in our <u>interim report</u> that while the Scottish system performs well, there is certainly room for improvement.
